
'10 Pointers' from our New Principal

1st Manmohan Memorial Interschool 7-A-Side Football Tournament



Gandhi House On Duty for October Month



On this day, Modi addressed the citizens of India in a public gathering held at Rajghat, New Delhi, India and asked everyone to actively participate in the campaign. Our school too laid the first stone after being inspired by the cleanliness venture. We had a small session on "Waste Management" by Meenakshi Ma'am who worked for an organization called "Waste Warriors". She taught us to differentiate biodegradable, non-biodegradable, dry and wet waste. We also learnt how long a plastic or a glass article could take to decompose. She talked of how unhygienic our Earth had become and it will not be as beautiful as it was earlier, which generated concerns in our minds.

On November 15th, we had finally set in motion for our campaign to the local area of Naukuchiatal and the places in vicinity. We began our march at about 12:00 noon from the gates of the school with posters, banners and most importantly with the desire of living in a clean environment. To grace the occasion, our honorable Principal Sir, Administrator Sir, Mr. Reinna Kikushi (CEO at Learning Systems Co Ltd., Japan) and all our senior school teachers also joined which motivated us even more. As we reached Kamaltal, we quickly wore our gloves and got in action. We cleaned the littered area by picking up plastic bottles, wrappers, cans, etc. from the road. We then asked about the issues which concerned them, regarding proper waste disposal, and they answered they require dustbins, sweepers and a weekly check from the municipality officers. This campaign was really something to be appreciated as it was an effort to make tomorrow a better place to live in.



The Bravest Girl in The World: Malala Yousafzai

Malala Yousafzai is an activist for female education and the youngest and the first Pakistani Nobel Peace Prize recipient... She is so much like us, a teenage girl, with hopes and dreams of her own, yet so different. Malala Yousafzai was born on July 12, 1997, in Mingora, Pakistan. As a child, she became an advocate for girls' education, which resulted in the Taliban issuing a death threat against her. On October 9, 2012, a gunman shot Malala when she was traveling home from school. She survived, and has continued to speak out on the importance of education. The shooting resulted in a massive outpouring of support for Yousafzai, which continued during her recovery. She gave a speech at the United Nations on her 16th birthday, in 2013. She has also written an autobiography, I Am Malala: The Girl Who Stood Up for Education and Was Shot by the Taliban, which was released in October 2013. She was nominated for a Nobel Peace Prize in 2013. In 2014, she was nominated again and won, becoming the youngest person to receive the Nobel Peace Prize.

From a Nameless Activist To A Nobel Prize Winner: Kailash Satyarthi

Born on 11 January 1954, in Vidisha, Madhya Pradesh, India, Kailash Satyarthi is an Indian children's rights advocate and an activist against child labor. He completed his degree in electrical engineering, a post-graduate degree in high-voltage engineering and then joined a college in Bhopal as a lecturer for a few years. In 1980, he gave up his career and became secretary general for the Bonded Labor Liberation Front; he also founded the Bachpan Bachao Andolan (Save the Childhood Mission) that year. Satyarthi has been the subject of a number of documentaries, television series, talk shows, advocacy and awareness films. His work is recognized through various national and international honours and awards including the Nobel Peace Prize of 2014, which he shared with Malala Yousafzai...




New approach needed to save coral reef


